Status of the course in the study program:

Compulsory in the programme of Political and cultural geography, voluntary in the programme of Geography and regional development.

Course description:

The base of ethnic questions is the topic of this course. Ethnic theory and main terms are presented in the first part. The difference between approaches to these questions in the Western and Eastern Europe is the main part of it. Second part presents history of development of ethnic structure in Czechia. Topic of third part of the course is contemporary ethnic situation in Czechia including regional identities: Moravian and Silesian. Fourth part contains Czech legal regulations with emphasis to difference between minorities and foreigners in the Czech law. The fifth part of the course describes situation of foreign immigrants in Czechia. The last part contains prognosis of the ethnic question in Czechia and compare with some other countries.

Aims and objectives of the course:

Introducing to ethnic theory and the practice of Czech Republic.

Improving of knowledge of the field of ethnic questions.

Forming of a skill to implement this knowledge in administration of ethnic questions at the national and local level.
